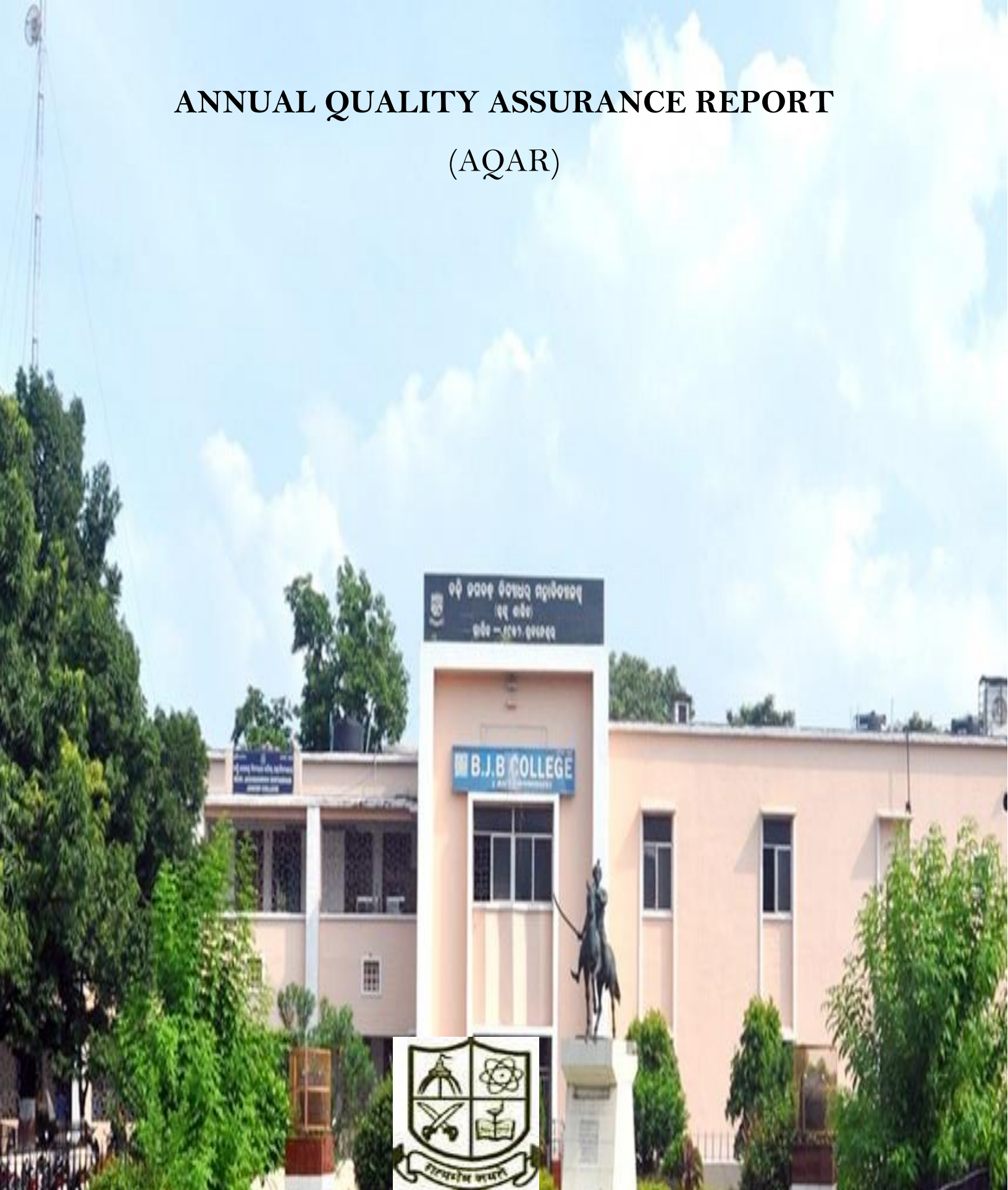

IQAC organises regular meeting with all the H.O.D.s regarding the progress and use of innovative approaches. IQAC has organised worship for the students as well as faculty members regarding conversion of marks to grades SGPA and CGPA. That is an initiative undertaken by IQAC for developing awareness about Marks and Grades conversion. IQAC has taken initiative regarding organisation of refresher and orientation progress in different subjects for strengthening teaching learning process. IQAC organises Parent-Teacher meeting and Alumni meeting where the suggestions of Parents and Alumni are mostly focused for the improvement of teaching learning process. Besides students' feedback is collected and analysed for the improvement of teaching learning process.

3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

Students volunteers and Rovers and Rangers unit of the College had participated in Pathautsav at Rajpath, Bhubaneswar. As per the discussion made in the IQAC, equal opportunity cell of the college has constituted a scribe club for the visually challenged students of the College. The NSS wing of the College has organised different activities in the College like acting as volunteers in Asian Athletic Meet-2017, participated in Biju Pattanaik Mini marathon, 2018, observation of world spinal injury day, participation in world consumer Right day – 2017, observing audio books for blinds, participation in workshop on “Better Style-better life and Mass Rally on world Aids day. NCC (Air Wing) students have participated blood donation camp, Anti drugs awareness campaign and joined in the Mini Marathon 2018. Students of NCC Army wing has excellent performance in different activities organised at State as well as National level. One NCC cadet of Army wing has awarded bronze medal in state level shooting competition and another cadet has awarded, gold Medal in State level shooting competition organised by Odisha Rifle association. Dr.Sadhana Satapathy, Counsellor of YRC received Rajiv Gandhi Sammana Award 2017 for best counsellor.

5.6 Details of student counselling and career guidance

Career Counselling by external agencies like BCS-ISB, Lucknow were extended to students of Bioinformatics department. Students were counselled through parent-teacher meeting. Soft skills are imparted by faculties in the Language Lab of the College. Experts are invited for interface in the department of THM. Lesson Plans and Progress Register are updated in all the departments regularly. In addition to regular classes, ICT enabled seminars are conducted. Efforts are going on to facilitate access to INFLIBNET on the part of the students and teachers. Collaborative learning, Cooperative learning, interactive methods and simulated teaching methods are adopted. In MSW Department for the manifestation of creative potential of the student, wall magazine is updated regularly and students' articles are published. Each and every student makes seminar presentation in MSW, Psychology and Education Department. Using LIBMS users can search library books online. Through INFELIBNET (NLLIST) Programme one can download 1, 35,000 e-books and 6,000 journals. So, library automation has facilitated the process of teaching and learning. Besides to give better exposure to students important website links are communicated to students.

One month filed study for the students is done by MSW Department where the students visit a community/slum/village.

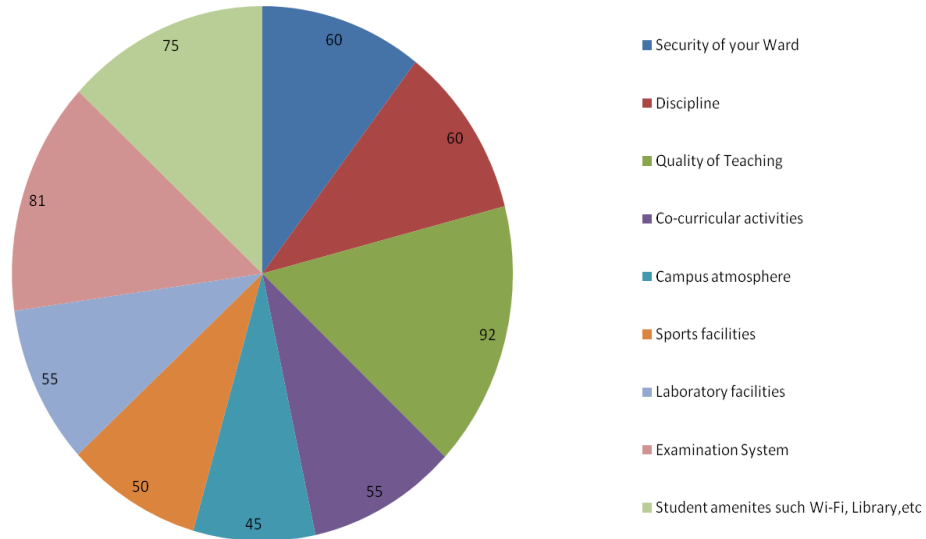

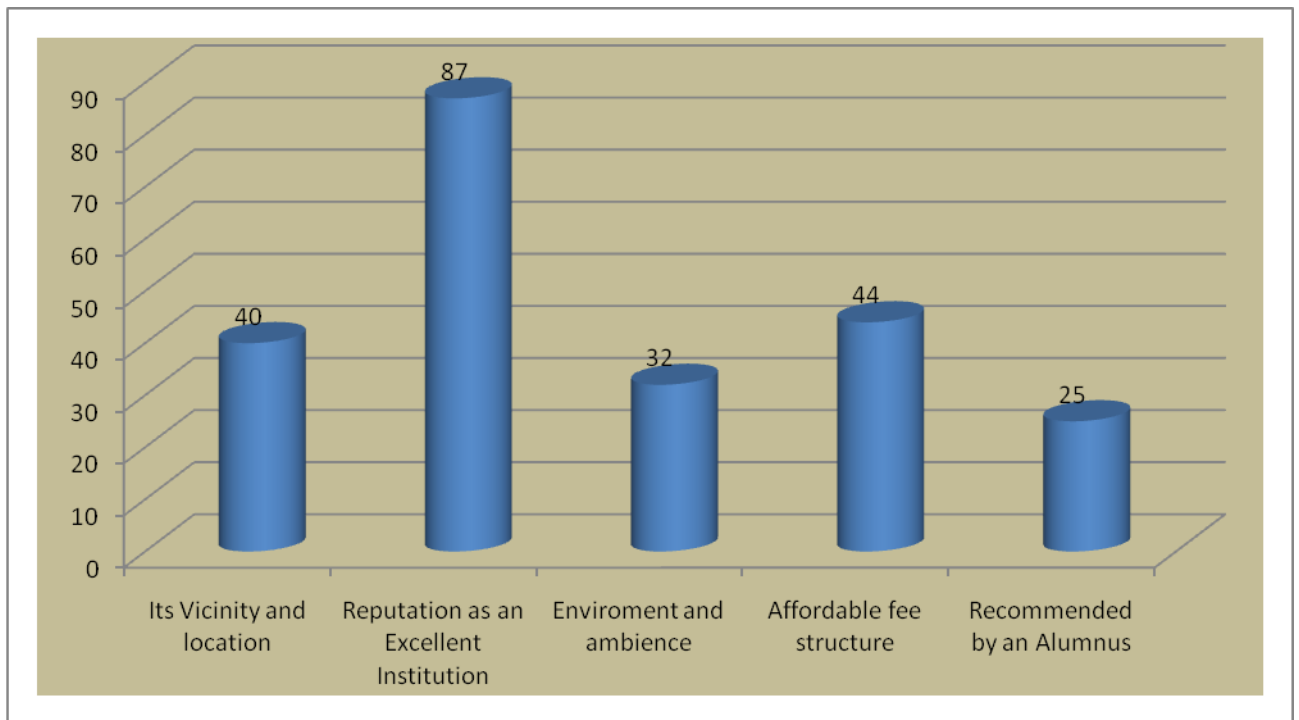

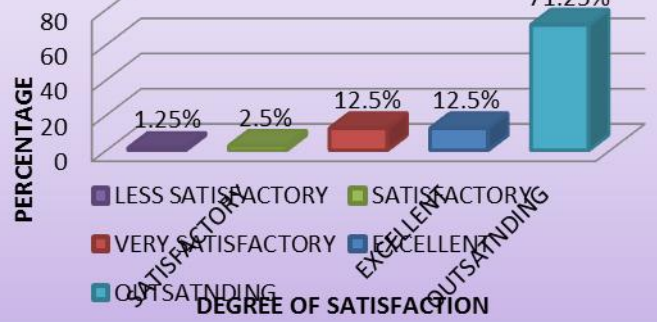

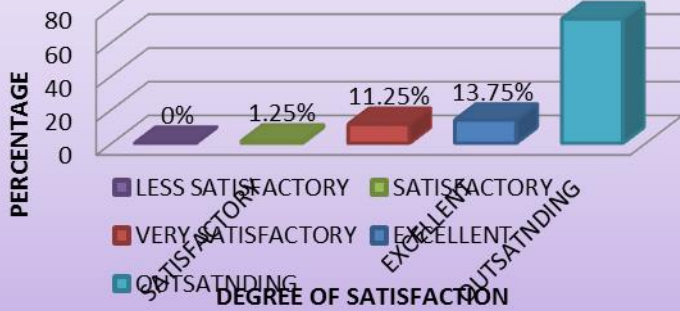

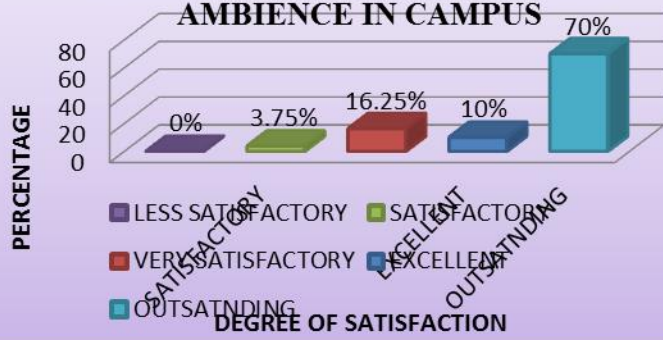

Objectives: To spread awareness about inclusive education and help in particular the students who are visually challenged.

Context : Organisation of a Scribe Club in the College.

Practice : Many students of the College belong to Person with Disability (PWD) category and some of them are visually challenged. Total number of Person with Disability (PWD) students in the College is 35. Students have been encouraged to work as scribe for the visually challenged (blind and partially blind). Students from NSS, YRC and “Rovers & Rangers” have volunteered to work as scribe for them mainly during examinations and classrooms.

Evidence of success: The visually challenged students have selected their scribe from the scribe club during their examinations and have come out successful.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required : On occasions the scribe volunteers have to take their examinations on the same day the PWD (visually challenged) candidates are required to take their own. Members of the scribe club should be trained by experts to understand the specific problems of the visually challenged.
